Tired of paying your Garrison Club invoice by cheque and then having to mail it?

Maybe Interac e-Transfer is right for you. For your convenience, I have gathered some information for you. This is simply for your information and is completely up to you if you choose this method or not.

What is Interac e-Transfer?

Interac e-Transfer is a convenient way to send and receive money directly from one bank account to another. All you need is access to online or mobile banking through a participating financial institution, and you can send money to anyone with an email address or mobile phone number and a bank account in Canada — without sharing any personal financial information.

- **It's fast** – Funds are received instantly
- **It's secure** - Money is transferred directly between financial institutions - without sharing any personally identifiable financial information. Users are protected with multiple layers of security. Your money does not travel by email or text message – only notifications and deposit instructions do. Your financial institution and the recipient's financial institution exchange funds using established and secure banking procedures. There are security measures in place to protect your *Interac* e-Transfer transaction.

- **It's easy** - Only a recipient's email address or mobile number is required to send money. To get started, log in to your online bank account and follow your participating financial institution's instructions to add a recipient and begin sending money.
- **It's convenient** - Transactions can be conducted anytime, anywhere via online or mobile banking
